## Adapting to Changing Needs

For those who desire a carefree lifestyle without the burden of housework or lawn maintenance, The Inn provides a thriving community of independent living residences. Residents can participate in a variety of enjoyable activities, outings, and social gatherings.

The Village at Waveny is uniquely dedicated to memory care and features an innovative Main Street design that

replicates nearby New Canaan’s downtown square.

“Every inch of the Village is therapeutically designed to stimulate memory and return a sense of normalcy to our residents,” says Kristin Sinatra, Director of Marketing.

Named one of the Best Nursing Homes in the country by *U.S. News & World Report*, Waveny Care Center offers both short- and long-term, inpatient and outpatient rehabilitation, including physical, speech, and occupational therapies. Skilled nursing services include IV, respiratory, and wound VAC therapies.

Waveny Home Healthcare and Waveny at Home provide a range of licensed and certified professional therapies and services delivered to residents residing within Fairfield County. “Older adults want to stay at home, so we’re bringing sophisticated care and personal attention directly to them,” notes Piper.

Also for those living at home, the Adult Day Program offers personal assistance, medical monitoring, and social interaction, while incorporating collaborative programs with residents of The Village and providing multiday reprieve to fulltime caregivers.

“As residents’ needs change, whether financially or care-wise, our continuum is designed to accommodate those changes—including priority access to our skilled nursing or memory care facilities. It’s the ultimate safety net,” says Shaun Powell, CFO, noting that Waveny’s resident-assistance fund is available for financial support and to ease such transitions.

Unique to Waveny is the Brown Geriatric Evaluation Clinic, which provides an interdisciplinary assessment of a patient’s cognitive, psychological, social, and medical status that helps patients and caregivers make appropriate healthcare decisions.

“We’re changing with the times and providing information to older adults as they plan and prepare for the future,” says Piper. “Getting to know your healthcare providers is always done better when you aren’t in a crisis situation.”
